Therefore, the preparation of an estate plan by a competent attorney serves as the distribution clause for the assets He has entrusted to us and demonstrates your desire to "honor the Lord with your substance" (Proverbs 3:9).

Making a Bequest to the Cornerstone Lutheran Church Foundation

A bequest (or devise) is a provision in your will or trust document that designates a specific gift or percentage of the residual to an individual or charity. Suggested bequest language to share with your attorney:

"I give, devise, and bequeath the (sum of/percentage of/residue of my estate) to the Cornerstone Lutheran Church (formerly Carmel Lutheran Church) Foundation, a not-for-profit corporation with principal offices located in Carmel, Indiana for the benefit of the Cornerstone Lutheran Church."
